Plus the chance to attend a wide choice of **FREE** training courses from an OCN in horticulture to short courses in food hygiene, first aid, healthy eating, health & safety, etc.



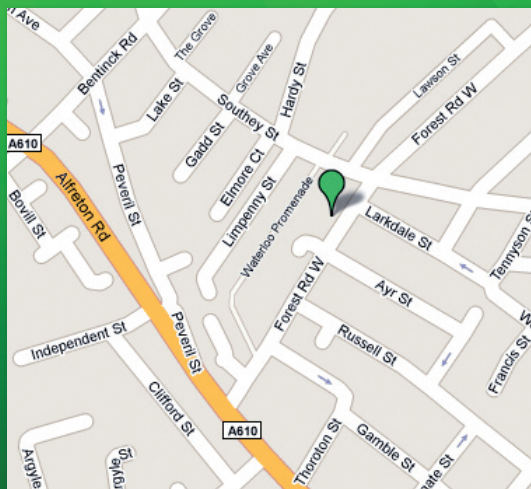
The Community Garden project is part of One Nottingham's Community Programme and Nottingham City Council's Job Plan to help get over 2,000 city residents into employment and training.

To offer you a wide range of exciting volunteering opportunities in the environmental field the Partnership Council has teamed up with green organisations such as Ecoworks, Groundwork Greater Nottingham, Stonebridge City farm and many more!

Placements will last for 3 months (but can be extended) and will involve volunteering for 8 to 16 hours a week. To be eligible for a placement you must be resident in Nottingham City, over 18 yrs and either unemployed or at risk of redundancy or in a low income job (and not currently enrolled as a student).

Every volunteer position will give you valuable work experience, new skills, support and training - **ABSOLUTELY FREE** - to help you get back into work and an exciting new career!
